
Freeman's familiarity with the market, dedicated team of specialists, and relentless focus on service have resulted in an international reputation for achieving exceptional prices and client satisfaction.

While we remain ingrained within the heart of the city that we have called home since 1805, we maintain our legacy by innovating in today's thriving auction world.







In a 2021 auction marked by significant interest in 20th century women artists, this remarkable sculpture by Barbara Hepworth was a standout, achieving more than double its pre-sale high estimate following a competitive bidding war. The auction achieved over \$1.8M overall in only 54 lots, with all but one lot sold.




Clyfford Still

This fresh-to-market work by the prominent Abstract Expressionist painter Clyfford Still was the highlight of a 2020 *Modern and Contemporary Art* auction that realized \$2.7M overall. The remarkable result for this oil on paper was five times the work's pre-sale high estimate, resulting in the second highest price ever achieved for a work on paper by Still.



In 2019, Freeman's proudly presented The Collection of Mr. and Mrs. Richard E. Oldenburg. A selection of works emblematic of the Oldenburgs' collecting passions were offered in a variety of auctions, and notable among these pieces were works by Mimmo Rotella, Roy Lichtenstein, and Claes Oldenburg along with this elegant pencil-on-paper by Ellsworth Kelly. Many works achieved prices in excess of their high estimates thanks in part to their distinguished provenance.
